

Francis GURRY

Francis Gurry, a national of Australia, is Deputy Director General of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) in Geneva. He is responsible for WIPO's activities in the area of patents, which include patent policy questions and the administration of the Patent Cooperation Treaty (PCT), under which some 145,000 international patent applications were filed in 2006; biotechnology and genetic resource policy questions; traditional knowledge and the WIPO Arbitration and Mediation Center, which has administered over 26,000 disputes over Internet domain names since 2000.

Dr. Gurry holds law degrees from the University of Melbourne and a Doctor of Philosophy from the University of Cambridge in the United Kingdom. He is a Professorial Fellow of the Faculty of Law of the University of Melbourne.

He is the author of a textbook on the law of trade secrets and confidential information, entitled *Breach of Confidence*, published by Oxford University Press in the United Kingdom in 1984, and co-author, with Frederick Abbott and Thomas Cottier, of *The International Intellectual Property System: Commentary and Materials*, published by Kluwer in July 1999.

Michael LYDON

Ronald E. Myrick (Ron) is a partner in the law firm of Finnegan Henderson Farabow Garrett and Dunner, LLP. He has served as the Chief Intellectual Property Counsel of General Electric Company and as a Vice President responsible for legal and other functions in Digital Equipment Corporation, Otis Elevator (NAO) and Mostek Corporation. Ron has also served as a principal in the law firms of Fish and Richardson and Neuman, Williams, Anderson and Olson.

He is President of AIPPI, Trustee of the LES Foundation, and Division I Chair of the ABA IPL Section. He is a Past President of the American Intellectual Property Law Association. He is also Past President of the Intellectual Property Owners Association, and has served on the Council of the IPL Section of the ABA. He is currently also a leader in a number of other organizations including the USCIB, and the ICC . He is a member of the Dispute Resolution Section of ABA, and of the Association for Conflict Resolution. He served a three-year term on the Patent-Public Advisory Committee. He taught law at Suffolk University Law School.

He has served as a member of a number of Boards of Directors or Trustees.

He has extensive background in IP asset management, strategy setting, dealing with senior management, as well as extensive experience in the breadth of IP practice both as inside counsel and outside counsel, including litigation budgeting and management, transactions and licensing, and international relations. He has been recognized for his contribution to the improvement of quality of IP operations inside corporations and law firms.

Dr. Steiling is Chief Patent Counsel at Bayer AG.
